## Aquamarine

Aquamarine is the blue to blue-green variety of the mineral beryl. The name comes from the Latin words aqua, meaning "water," and marina, meaning "of the sea." The gem was believed to give the wearer protection against foes in battle. While Brazil has been the main source of aquamarine since 1811, other sources include Pakistan and Uruguay.
